

SPOTLIGHT Saskatchewan

Producers in Saskatchewan indicate they are highly* motivated to improve safety on their operation. However, they still see barriers preventing the consistent implementation of safe practices and most Saskatchewan producers have not accessed safety information/ training this year. Most producers have a safety plan in place; however, almost all of these plans are unwritten and cover limited measures. Producers feel these plans are effective in preventing injury on their operation. Most producers believe the work on their operation is done safely most or all of the time, despite a quarter having had some type of incident on their operation within the last year.

Top Health & Safety Risks Identified on Operation:

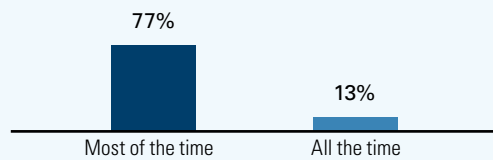
What types of health and safety risks have you identified on your operation? n = 166

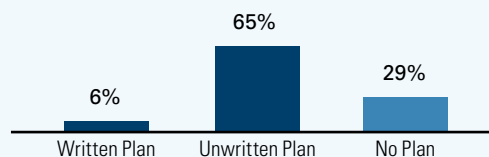
