Resolution Process

The CASA Policies and Procedures set out CASA's Resolution Process in Section VII.

From the CASA's Resolution Process Policy:

Overview:

The resolutions process is an essential part of the larger democratic process which governs the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association. It is designed to allow for input into the policy development by members, and the Board itself in order to maintain the grassroots system for policy development, call for formal action or support on a specific issue or concern.

The CASA Board of Directors has reviewed this policy and determined it does not align with the current vision of CASA. Having a structured process that suggests members can only bring forward matters annually at the AGM through a resolution does not support a goal of continual communication and collaboration with partners in Agricultural Health and Safety. The CASA Board of Directors has struck out this policy.

CASA recognizes that engaging with partners and stakeholders to understand grassroots challenges is essential to support Agricultural Health and Safety and CASA's success. It was decided that CASA and stakeholders would be better served through regular engagement tactics through the CASA office and staff. This will allow for emerging issues to be brought to the attention of CASA and its membership. Furthermore, it will allow CASA to act and collaborate with partners on these matters.

Engagement tactics will include:

Partner meetings

Agriculture Health and Safety Forums

Stakeholder meeting and engagement

Online "suggestion box"
